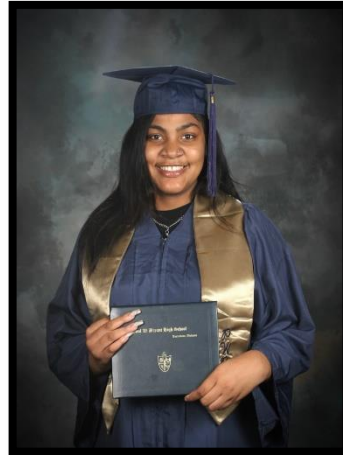

Anger Management Coping Skills

1. **Be aware of your triggers.** Knowing your triggers, and being cautious around them, will reduce the likelihood of your anger getting out of control.
2. **Practice deep breathing.**
3. **Keep an anger log.** Identifying patterns, warning signs, and triggers can help you organize thoughts and work through problems.
4. **Use diversions.** The goal of diversions is to buy yourself time. If you can distract yourself for just 30 minutes, you'll have a better chance of dealing with your anger in a healthy way.
5. **Take a time-out.** Walk away from the problem and return once you have had an opportunity to cool down.
6. **Know your warning signs.** Anger warning signs are the clues your body gives you that your anger is starting to grow.
